Project Overview

Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport (ANC) is in need of a Master Plan Update that provides Airport management and the State of Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (DOT&PF) with a strategy for continued development.

An airport master plan, developed in accordance with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements, is a comprehensive study that envisions short-, medium-, and long-term development plans. Usually, master plan updates occur every 5 to 7 years. It has been 11 years since the last Master Plan Update for ANC was adopted in 2002. Planning efforts in 2008 resulted in a study report, but it was not formally adopted as a Master Plan Update.

Anchorage International Airport, operated by the Alaska DOT&PF, is among the most unique airports in the United States serving as a vital transportation link to Alaska, and as a vital cargo link between Asia and North America. The largest airport in the state, Anchorage International Airport supports one in ten jobs in the Anchorage area

Anchorage International Airport is planning for the future. This Master Plan Update will be a roadmap for future development to meet the needs of the traveling public, the aviation industry and the airport.

and is an economic driver in Southcentral Alaska. Globally, Anchorage International Airport is one of the top five airports for cargo throughput by weight.

Following federal requirements, and with input from the public, Anchorage International Airport will select a development alternative and build a long term implementation strategy that will ensure that Alaska's largest and busiest airport will meet anticipated aeronautical needs in the coming decades.

Schedule

This Master Plan Update will take about eighteen months to complete, from June 2012 to December 2013.





Key Issues

The Anchorage International Airport Master Plan Update is foremost an aeronautical study designed to maximize operational efficiency and business effectiveness at the airport. Based on stakeholder input, the chart below outlines the key elements that will be addressed in this master plan.
